Rules for Exhibition

ENTERING OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits may be entered between 10am and 3pm on Friday.

PLEASE BRING ADDRESS LABELS IF YOU HAVE SEVERAL EXHIBITS

Exhibitors must have a fair button to enter exhibits

Exhibits must have been made or grown within the last year by the person exhibiting them.

Exhibitors may enter only one exhibit per lot and it must meet requirements as described in this book.

The Fair Association may remove any entry if it deems it unsuitable for the exhibition.

Children can enter as many exhibits as they want (1 per lot), but prize total can not exceed \$25.

Children can not exhibit in both adult and childrens categories. All exhibits must be in one category.

JUDGING OF EXHIBITS

Judging begins at 5PM, Friday. The exhibition area will be closed during judging. The judge may change the lot number of an incorrectly entered exhibit. The judge is not obligated to give a prize if the exhibit does not merit it.

The judge's records are the final decision on any ribbon or premium errors. In adult categories, categories may not have a 1st place winner, based on judge's discretion.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits must be removed between 3PM – 5PM on Sunday. The Fair Association will dispose of any remaining exhibits Premium checks need to be picked up on Sunday between 3PM - 5PM otherwise premium check will be returned to the fair treasury.

NOTICE:

Removal of exhibits before 3PM on Sunday will result in forfietures of premiums.

Entry Preparation

VEGETABLES

All vegetables should be fresh, crisp, and clean; true to type, uniform in size, shape and color; free of defects, insects, blemishes and disease.

Beans: green, pole and wax beans should be picked when the seeds are about half grown, before constrictions appear between the seeds. Lima beans should be picked when the seeds are full grown, but are still green, not white. Wipe clean – do not wash.

Beets, Carrots, Parsnips, Rutabagas, and Turnips: Roots should be mature but not overgrown. Trim tops 1"-2" above crown. Remove side roots, but leave tap root. May wash, but don't injure skin.

Broccoli: Heads should be compact and dark colored, cut stems to 5"

Cabbage: Wrapper leaves are desirable but bad leaves should be trimmed. Trim roots ½" below head. May be washed.

Cauliflower: Heads should be of good color and be free of small leaves. Cut stems so 4-6 leaves remain, trim these 2" above the head.

Celery, Kale, Spinach, and Chard: Wash and trim roots to 2"; tie loosely.

Cucumbers: Wipe clean, slices should be dark green, ripe should be yellow-orange in color, wipe clean.

Eggplant, Peppers, Tomatoes: Wipe clean. Leaves stems on eggplants, peppers and green tomatoes.

Endive, Lettuce: Trim bad leaves, leave stems, no container of water.

Kholrabi: Trim roots and all but 4-5 leaves, trim leaves to 3"

Melons, squash, and pumpkins: Wipe clean, cut stem to 3"-5"

Onions: Trim roots to $\frac{1}{2}$ " bunching may be peeled and trimmed to 6"-8", other onions should have tops dried off and outer skin on.

Peas: Leave stems on. Do not wash

Radishes: Remove bad leaves, wash and trim roots, tie loosely

Rhubarb: Pull stalks, trim leaves so 2" blade remains

Sweet corn: Ears may be opened, but leave husks on, trim shank to 3"

FLOWERS

Flowers should be displayed in clear glass (not plastic) container. Stems should include some foliage but remove leaves below the water line. Flowers are judged by uniformity in size, shape, and color, free of damage and required number of stems or blooms. **ARRANGEMENTS:** Arrangements will be judged by overall design, color, harmony, quality of material, container design, workmanship, and artistic merit. No artificial flowers.

POTTED PLANTS

Potted plants should be potted for atleast 2 months, be free of dirt, dust, insects, disease, and damage. The decorativeness of the pots will not be judged. Flowering plants must be in bloom.
